[Calgary International Airport allows Uber pickups at arrivals zone](#)

Passengers arriving at YYC International Airport will now have the choice of catching a taxi or an Uber from the arrivals area.

It was previously possible to hail an Uber for pickup at the airport, but those wishing to do so had to go back to the departures level.

In a release, the YYC Calgary Airport Authority said rideshare pickup locations have now moved to arrival level doors 3, 11 and 15. Uber is currently the only rideshare company operating in Calgary.

The changes came into effect on Feb. 1.

“Guests arriving in Calgary have different needs when it comes to ground transportation,” said Rob Palmer, VP Commercial, Strategy & CFO. “That’s why we offer various options from ride-share, rental cars, city transit, taxi and sedan services. These convenient offerings reflect YYC’s growth and recovery now that passenger volumes are more predictable.”

[Tulsa airport launches virtual taxicab system](#)

TULSA, Okla. — Tulsa International Airport recently launched a new virtual taxicab queueing system with UnDelay, an aviation data analytics and tech company, the airport announced on Thursday.

UnDelay’s web-based software now allows taxi drivers to enter the virtual “queueing zone” from a remote location, instead of physically parking in the lot south of the airport. The system will then alert drivers when it is their turn to approach the terminal curb and pick up passengers.

The system will also give the airport the capability to see which drivers have paid, so an airport staff member will no longer have to physically check their receipts.

“Automation is essential in aviation operations, and it will increase customer satisfaction and revenue,” said Safir Monroe, Founder and CEO of UnDelay. “While working as a software engineer at Delta Air Lines, I saw a huge need in data analytics and the optimization of aviation systems. After leaving the company, I wanted to help make a huge difference in the travel industry so I created UnDelay to help reduce the problems airports and airlines were having with landside and airside operations.”

Plans for the future, 15-mile-long, north-south corridor known as [Tucson Norte-Sur](#) focus not only on transit but on walkability, housing density and affordability in the neighborhoods up to a mile on either side of the route.

[London Airports set to charge travellers over 67% extra for parking](#)

A necessity for those that travel, often forgotten until the last minute, is finding airport parking. With the option of getting the train becoming less possible, those who haven't sorted it out yet should be aware it's about to get a lot more costly.

British travelers heading out for romantic trips over Valentine's Day weekend will face a cost of a living squeeze – as the price of airport parking soars. Lovers are expected to pay up to 67% more than if they were travelling on the same dates in March.

New data by YourParkingSpace has revealed that various UK airports are increasing car parking fees during this romantic time, with motorists expected to pay as much as £57.90 more for these dates.

[Landline shuttle joining Sun Country service in Eau Claire](#)

EAU CLAIRE — A shuttle service that will drive passengers from the Eau Claire airport to Sun Country Airlines flights departing from the Twin Cities is set to begin service next month.

The airline and ground transportation service Landline made a joint announcement this week about the new service that will start March 2 at Chippewa Valley Regional Airport, 3800 Starr Ave.

The new shuttle service is being done in addition to local Sun Country flights, which fly four times a week between Eau Claire and Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport.

The Landline service can be booked just like a connecting flight by going to suncountry.com. The website will indicate which leg of the journey will be ground transport versus in the air.

Cost for the shuttle trip is \$10 for one-way travel and \$20 for round-trip, according to a Sun Country news release issued on Wednesday. Passengers who use Landline can check bags at the Eau Claire airport and their luggage will be transferred onto their flights at the Minneapolis airport.

There is another airport shuttle service that has already been doing business in Eau Claire. Groome Transportation offers shuttle service departing from the city's northwest side at 6204 Chuck Lane and drives to the airport in the Twin Cities.

The [UK Government](#) announced on Wednesday that future deployments as part of the Connected and Autonomous Vehicles Forth (CavForth) project would involve “smaller vehicles which could operate with no staff on board”.

However, [Stagecoach](#), which will operate the service, later clarified that the service was likely to always need staff on board and the staffless vehicle trial was expected to be aimed at shuttle services such as in airport car parks.

The initial “captained” 14-mile CavForth route, using electric single decker buses with a driver on board, is to be extended by five miles from the Ferrytoll park and ride site north of the Forth Road Bridge to Dunfermline.

[National Parking Association Announces Findings in Post-Pandemic Road to Recovery Index](#)

WASHINGTON, Feb. 6, 2023 /PRNewswire/ -- The National Parking Association (NPA), the leading authority on parking research, released findings from its fourth Road to Recovery Index that

indicates a very strong rebound nationally. Americans are driving at levels greater than in 2019, in turn, parking operator revenue is projected to recover fully between August and December of 2023.

"The parking industry continues to rebound post-pandemic and projects \$580 billion* in revenue by the end of 2023, outpacing the 2019 baseline by 2% and 2022 revenue growth by 10%," said NPA President Christine Banning, IOM, CAE. "A focus on consumer experience, automation, and diversifying services has fueled a rebound across sectors."

Banning added, "Airport and event parking were the fastest areas to rebound due to consumer demand. As a result, airport parking revenue increased by 26% in the first half of 2022 from 2019 levels, while event parking revenue increased 16% during the same period. Consumer demand for leisure travel and event venues signals continued strength in those parking segments in 2023."

The airports are the most common type of transportation medium for international travelers and tourists. An airport can have multiple terminals, and aircrafts are assigned specific terminal for landing. The terminal and main airport building can be far, and passengers cannot walk to the aircrafts from building and other way around with luggage.

To make the transfer of passenger and luggage from building and aircraft, there are several vehicles, scheduled according to the flights or can be booked by passengers according to their convenience.

This airport ground transportation is sometimes organized by airline, as a service included along with flight. Sometimes, third party transportation is used by travel agencies and sometimes, passengers can get their own vehicle, using applications and websites of transportation providing agencies. These vehicles are usually buses, taxis and sometimes trains, if available.

[Driving success: Uber eyes profitability as airport and office journeys fuel post-pandemic rideshare demand](#)

Uber said it had set its sights on delivering profits this year after 2022's surge in demand for airport and office rides helped the company rebound from pandemic lows.

Dara Khosrowshahi, chief executive of Uber, said the company was now focused on achieving profitability on a GAAP basis this year.

Khosrowshahi said: "The pandemic's impact on our mobility business is now well and truly behind us."

Uber forecast adjusted EBITDA, a profitability metric that excludes some costs, is between \$660m (£546m) and \$700m for the first quarter, above the average analyst estimate of \$593.06m, according to Refinitiv data.

There are plenty of things that give economist Jeremy Aguero sleepless nights.

Last week, Aguero, of Las Vegas-based Applied Analysis, admitted airport capacity has become one of those issues.

"There are a lot of things that worry me," Aguero said. "I'm worried about I-15. I'm worried about water policy. I'm worried about the airport. I'm worried about having enough employees. This is one of a number of things that keeps me up at night. I don't know if that should be a determinant factor, but the fact that we are going to hit capacity before we have a plan in place to expand capacity, yeah, that's one of the top five things that keeps me up at night."

Aguero also noted his airport capacity concern last month during his keynote speech at the Vegas Chamber's Preview 2023 forecasting event.

[Reid airport employees fight plan to free up more public parking](#)

“This is another effort to enhance the customer experience as record volumes of passengers continue to travel through the airport and certain parking options reach capacity more frequently,” according to a news release last month.

[Cleveland Hopkins looks to add rental car fee to fund future capital improvements](#)

CLEVELAND — Cleveland Hopkins International Airport is looking to assess a new fee on travelers who rent cars at the airport in order to fund the construction of a new rental car terminal on the airport campus.

If approved, the so-called customer facilities charge would likely be paid by non-Cleveland residents, which accounted for 96% of the rental car volume last year, according to city data.

Although airport officials are still determining the exact rate, Dennis Kramer, the interim director of port control, told members of Cleveland City Council’s Transportation and Mobility Committee that they are anticipating the fee to be in the ballpark of \$4 to \$8 per rental day. The rate would be determined by the city’s Board of Control.

[Myrtle Beach International Airport sets new passenger record in 2022](#)

MYRTLE BEACH, S.C. (WPDE) — For the second consecutive year, the Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR) has set a new record for total passenger traffic.

In 2022, nearly 3.5 million passengers traveled through the airport.

Total passenger traffic included 3,459,803 passengers for 2022 compared to 3,210,247 in 2021.

The number of people arriving on flights or deplanements totaled 1,725,861 compared to 1,604,110 the previous year.

“2022 was a great year for the Myrtle Beach International Airport,” said Judi Olmstead, Assistant Director of Airports. “3.5M travelers speaks volumes to the success of the airport and the

destination. Our population base continues to expand and the airport saw more residents than ever utilizing the airport, which is why the airport remains committed to promoting the region to foster new air service options while maintaining existing service levels."

With added traffic through the airport, comes a need for more space and accommodations.

According to Olmstead, MYR is working on a parking expansion project and terminal expansion and has already added a [new airline](#) and new flight destinations.

The airport also added six therapy dogs as well as the introduction of the [Sunflower Lanyard Program](#) in 2022.
