

New From Lyft: Preorder Your Ride When You Land!

We've all been there: Making our way through the airport after landing, wondering whether to hit "request" for a rideshare right away or wait until the pickup area – wherever that is. Lyft is rolling out a new feature that could help eliminate the guesswork.

The rideshare company recently announced it is rolling out a new feature that lets travelers preorder a ride as soon as their flight lands. Available at just a few major U.S. airports to start, the app will track your location after requesting a ride, eventually matching you with a driver as you get close to the pickup area. That means you don't need to rush to the pickup zone nor worry about how long it might take to grab your luggage from the baggage claim.

You won't find the option to order your Lyft ride everywhere just yet. At launch, this new preorder feature is only available at three airports:

- Los Angeles (LAX)
- Chicago-O'Hare (ORD)
- Chicago-Midway (MDW)

'I don't need to dethrone a king': New Lyft CEO says the company can succeed without annihilating Uber

CNBC - May 12, 2023

<u>Lyft</u> CEO David Risher told CNBC's <u>Jim Cramer</u> on Friday he doesn't need to annihilate the competition — namely ride-share behemoth, <u>Uber</u>— to successfully turn around the <u>struggling</u> <u>company</u>.

"I don't need to dethrone a king," Risher said, insisting the current market warrants two players because customers and drivers like to have options. "Five years from now, I hope people are no longer asking about Uber and Lyft," Risher continued, "I hope what they're saying is, 'Look what an amazing experience Lyft has created that'll help us get out and live our lives."

Risher assumed the role of Lyft CEO just under a month ago, <u>taking the reins</u> from one of the company's co-founders, Logan Green. Risher made his name as an <u>Amazon</u> retail executive, joining the company in 1997 as its 37th employee, he told Cramer; he left in 2002.

Abilene Regional Airport and Turo car rental service come to an agreement Nexstar Media - May 11, 2023

ABILENE, Texas (<u>KTAB/KRBC</u>) – Turo is a peer-to-peer rental car service that has been facing disagreements with various airports. While some have taken legal action, Abilene Regional Airport has come to a conclusion for Turo to operate on airport grounds.

Many airports were upset due to Turo operating on airport grounds without letting them know, causing controversy for the rental service. Transportation Services Director Don Green said contributing factors can be due to the airport wanting to be informed of what's happening on the grounds and have a share of the revenue for providing infrastructure.

The airport and Turo have agreed for the company to pay 10% of commissions that occur at the airport, which is the base rate charged to other car rental services as well. However, there will not be a minimum annual guarantee that the airport has with other services. Turo will also be

responsible for paying local and state taxes for transactions and sending a report monthly showing every transaction on airport grounds.

Airport urges passengers to arrange ground transport pre-flight

Limited public transport options and a dwindling number of taxi and rideshare drivers has prompted officials at Bill and Hillary Clinton National Airport to urge passengers to pre-arrange travel from the airport, especially late at night.

The rapid development of the rideshare industry <u>has meant</u> declining fortunes for taxi companies, as consumers increasingly began getting rides via apps on their smartphones instead of by hailing cabs. Many taxi companies have shifted a focus away from individual fares to services like medical transports.

The taxi and rideshare industries both suffered immensely from the covid-19 pandemic, with so many people staying at home. Air travel dropped off sharply but recently rebounded to 2019 levels.

NORFOLK, Neb. -- The Norfolk Regional Airport is ramping up its efforts to attract more businesses to the area.

Bill Jepsen, marketing coordinator at the airport, believes they can help Norfolk increase business.

"We're trying to bring more businesses into Norfolk," he said. "Time is money, they (business owners) don't want to go someplace and drive a couple hours."

Police crack down on taxis after complaints

Jackson Hole News & Guide - May 17, 2023

The Jackson Police Department is cracking down on taxi companies shirking town rules.

Six citations have been issued to five drivers since January, according to Lt. Russ Ruschill of the Jackson Police Department. The citations don't include the name of the taxi company, only the name of the violator.

"We focused heavily on taxi enforcement in March," Police Chief Michelle Weber said. "We were doing compliance checks and inspections. There's a checklist of things taxi drivers are required to have."

For one thing, fares have to be posted in the vehicle so that the price of a cab ride is disclosed up front to the passenger. Officers doing random inspections at the airport found that taxis were not displaying fares and therefore were out of compliance.

CWA Rideshare Workers Strike for Safety and Better Working Conditions

Over 250 rideshare and taxi drivers went on strike at the Denver International Airport last Thursday to raise wages, stop unfair terminations, and create safer conditions for drivers. The strike was organized by Colorado Independent Drivers United (CIDU), CWA Local 7777, and was led by a strike committee composed of 18 drivers. The strikers effectively shut down the holding lot at the airport, where drivers are required to wait for trip requests. Community allies, including elected officials and candidates for elected office, religious leaders, and leaders in the Black community joined the strikers. The Denver strike was part of a national day of action by Uber and Lyft drivers coordinated by PowerSwitch Action that included other driver actions in New York, Chicago, Seattle, Los Angeles, and San Francisco.

Two days before the strike, the Colorado Senate Finance Committee voted down the CIDU-sponsored "Gig Work Transparency" legislation. The bill would have required gig companies to disclose the amount they take from fares to drivers and passengers, as well as set up a grievance system in which drivers who were unjustly terminated would have a path back to reinstatement.

Hertz Apologizes After U.S. Citizen From Puerto Rico Is Denied Car Rental

Hertz, the rental car chain, has apologized after an employee refused to give a Puerto Rican man his prepaid reserved car at Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport because he presented a driver's license issued on the island instead of a passport.

The man, Humberto Marchand, recorded and <u>described part of the incident at the Hertz counter</u> in Kenner, La., and shared it <u>on Twitter</u> on May 10. It was widely viewed as others told similar stories of how Americans often fail to realize that people born in Puerto Rico, a U.S. commonwealth, are American citizens.

Mr. Marchand began <u>recording</u> while the interaction with the Hertz employee was already underway, and apparently after she had requested his passport instead of permitting him to use his driver's license, issued in Puerto Rico.

Driverless staff bus starts running at airport

News RTHK - May 12, 2023

The Airport Authority said a driverless shuttle bus started running on Friday, carrying staff to work across the airport's restricted area.

The bus can carry 14 passengers at a time and operates 12 hours a day.

Steven Yiu, executive director of airport operations, said only one such bus is in use at the moment, but more will be introduced in future.

"It is part of our smart airport initiative. The objective is not only saving manpower, [but also] increasing the efficiency and safety," he said.

"We plan to increase the [number of] autonomous vehicles to five to ten in the near future."

Yiu added that the authority is planning to use driverless vehicles to carry air passengers to and from the airport, SKYCITY and Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge border facilities by next year.

The airport has used autonomous driving technology since 2019, with patrol cars and tractors that deliver luggage and cargo.

Deploying Electric Buses At Airports Is Easy With This Tool

As the U.S. aviation industry generates 2% of the nation's carbon dioxide emissions and consumes 10% of transportation energy, the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) is leading the way to find pathways to sustainability, including through sustainable aviation fuels, electrification, and new transportation options for moving small groups in dense city centers.

NREL researchers recently developed <u>a simulation-based optimization</u> modeling framework to help Dallas Fort Worth International Airport (DFW) transportation operators design effective electric bus deployment strategies. The model analyzed real-world conditions and simulated the existing DFW system to determine optimal battery capacity, charging power, and number of charging stations while minimizing capital cost and emissions.

<u>Driverless cars are causing more and more traffic issues in San Francisco</u>

Driverless cars were once touted as the saviour of transportation, but the reality is that the current automated vehicle technology efforts are causing real problems for the city of San Francisco.

An <u>NBC News report on YouTube</u> talks about how driverless cars from GM's Cruise and Google's Waymo, which got permission to offer cab services in <u>San Fransico in 2022</u>, are now responsible for three 911 calls a day in the city. The report says the cars can get confused and stop entirely if they encounter construction or red lights from emergency vehicles, leading to traffic jams.

It's a particular problem for the city's fire department and first responders. One fire chief says she sees at least one incident a day with driverless vehicles. Other reports filed by the department include autonomous vehicles driving toward active fire scenes and running over hoses. One report claims firefighters had to break one of these cars' windows in order to stop it. The fire chief interviewed stated she doesn't believe these cars are "ready for prime time."

Gig work value is too great to rush a US overhaul

WASHINGTON - American freelancers could be in for a summer surprise. The Department of Labor under President Joe Biden has pitched <u>a rule</u> that would classify many gig workers as traditional employees, and Biden's pick for the next secretary of labor backs such a policy. The proposal could secure benefits for freelancers. Yet those perks come at a price to them and the economy in general. As these gigs grow, a rushed rethink could do needless harm to millions of workers.

Julie Su, the president's choice for labor secretary, has a <u>history</u> of redefining gig work. During her time as California's labor commissioner, Su supported legislation that deemed many gig workers, including delivery and rideshare drivers, employees. If she is approved by the Senate, she could advance Biden's proposal for a nationwide overhaul.

Parking expansion adds 1,100 spaces to Terminal 1 at Harry Reid International Airport KTNV.com - May 15, 2023

LAS VEGAS (KTNV) — A new economy parking lot will soon be open to the public at Las Vegas' Harry Reid International Airport, a spokesperson announced on Monday.

The new lot is expected to open the morning of Wednesday, May 17, "just in time for the summer travel season," airport spokesman Joe Rajchel stated in a news release.

It will include 1,100 public parking spaces. That's in addition to 600 covered, long-term spots that were added to the T1 parking garage at the end of March, Rajchel noted, making a total 1,700 parking spaces added over the past few months.
