

<u>United and Archer to open first air taxi route in Chicago</u> Airport Technology - *Mar. 24, 2023*

Archer Aviation, an electric vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) aircraft maker, and United Airlines have <u>unveiled plans for their first air taxi route</u> in Chicago.

The duo finalised O'Hare International Airport (ORD) and Vertiport Chicago as the next point-to-point route as part of their urban air mobility (UAM) network development.

Located in the Illinois Medical District, Vertiport Chicago is claimed to be the largest vertical aircraft take-off and landing facility in North America, while United's largest operations hub, ORD is expected to serve as a suitable location for United and Archer to advance their UAM operations.

Archer Aviation founder and CEO Adam Goldstein said: "We're thrilled to add Chicago to our growing list of initial launch cities as we continue to solidify our UAM network plans.

"We're looking forward to working with state and city leaders to bring an innovative transportation solution to the City of Chicago and its surrounding communities."

Montreal airport calls on province to crack down on 'illegal taxis'

Daniel Killin says he once got into a fake cab in the United States and realized only too late there was no meter tracking the fare.

The driver told him he had to cough up \$250, so Killin tried to get out but the child-safety locks were on and he couldn't open the door.

"That's why I use Uber," said Killin, noting he always checks the driver, car description and licence plate to ensure he's getting in the right car. "Don't just assume."

But fake taxis aren't just a problem in the United States. It's becoming a problem at the Montreal airport as well, as first reported in La Presse.

Individuals are greeting arriving travellers at the gate, offering them a ride for a fee. Meanwhile, their partner is waiting out in the car in a pickup area that is far from the designated taxi stand.

"That's very worrisome for us, for the security of our passengers," said Anne-Sophie Hamel, a spokesperson with the airport authority, Aéroports de Montréal (ADM).

Port Authority advances plan to replace Airtrain Newark with selection of three firms as part of multi-phase procurement process

Brightline+ launches bi-directional shuttles serving MIA, Miami Beach

Brightline, the only provider of modern, eco-friendly, intercity rail in America, continues to connect South Florida with enhanced first and last mile mobility options.

Brightline+ now is offering guests new bi-directional fixed-route shuttles with available pickups at Miami International Airport (MIA) and three destinations in Miami Beach. Each shuttle will provide transfers to respective Brightline stations.

The new shuttle service operates on a fixed route schedule with designated locations, is trackable and does not require advance reservations. One-way rides are a flat rate of \$10 per person and can be paid for upon boarding shuttles.

HCMC airport set to make steep hike in fees for taxis

Taxis will have to pay a service fee to operate inside HCMC's Tan Son Nhat airport and pay another fee to pick up passengers.

Tan Son Nhat International Airport will collect a fee of VND9,100 (US\$0.38) from all taxis entering it from April 1.

Besides, TCP Vietnam Investment, which operates the parking lot at the airport, has said it will terminate the monthly contracts with taxis for renting space and instead switch to a fee to enter the terminal building.

They will have to pay a fee of VND5,000 or 15,000 each time, depending on where they choose to pick up passengers, with the higher fee applicable for the lane closest to the terminal.

The two new fees are on top of the airport entry fee of VND10,000.

Hannover Airport switches to digital parking

Passenger Terminal Today - Mar. 29, 2023

Hannover International Airport in Germany will switch to digital parking from April 2023.

The new system from Peter Park System will first be implemented in the short-term parking spaces on the arrivals level. Parking on the departure level will also go digital in the summer of 2023. When driving in and out of the terminal area, the license plate of the vehicle is read using a scanner and the parking time is automatically determined. Payment is made by entering the license plate number at one of the pay machines. The system offers several payment options including cash, cards, Apple Pay, Google Pay (NFC) as well as online payments via an app.

With this technology, the amount to be paid is limited to the length of time actually parked, and passengers will no longer have to pay in advance. Signs have been posted around the car park to remind travelers not to forget to pay before they leave. Once the payment process has been completed, the vehicle can leave the area without stopping. If passengers leave the parking area within the 10-minute free parking period, there is no parking fee.

<u>Greenville-Spartanburg International Airport's extra parking plan makes headway</u> <u>GSA Business Report</u> - *Mar.* 29, 2023

Due to an increase in passenger traffic levels, <u>Greenville-Spartanburg International Airport</u> is moving forward with plans to add a third parking garage to its facilities.

GSP is now reaching approximately 95% of its 2019 passenger traffic levels, said Tiffany Cherry, GSP communications manager.

"Airport staff are now forecasting that GSP should be fully back to our record-breaking 2019 passenger traffic levels in early to mid-2024," she added. "Parking and rental car demand have also increased as passenger traffic continues to recover from the impact of the pandemic."

Currently, on certain days of the week, both existing parking garages reach full capacity, she said. At the March 27 airport commission meeting, the commission airport management the go-ahead to revisit plans to construct a new parking garage and consolidated rental car facility at GSP.

New Kansas City airport terminal features ventilated parking facade from Bendheim Cision PR Newswire - Mar. 29, 2023

NEW YORK -- Architects selected an elegant and functional parking façade from <u>Bendheim</u> as part of a major upgrade for Kansas City International Airport.

A completely new air terminal for Kansas City opened on February 28, replacing two outmoded structures built in 1972. The extensive modernization effort also included a new seven-story parking structure. Over 2 million square feet in size, the building provides parking for 6,219 vehicles. Skidmore, Owings & Merrill served as principal architects for the overall project, named "Build KCI". The Kansas City-based firm of BNIM took lead on the parking facility, in a design-build partnership with general contractor JE Dunn.

Bendheim joined this effort from the design stage, collaborating with their partner Längle Glas to create custom-engineered fastening systems for the parking facility's ventilated façade. Bendheim ultimately provided over 50,000 square feet of tempered and laminated glass for the project. As a trained architect, Bendheim Vice President for Sales and Innovation Said Elieh was able to contribute to essential planning work before construction began.

"Having someone on the Bendheim side that understands the design vision we're trying to achieve, but then can bring that technical capacity on the manufacturer side to help realize that conceptual vision is important," explained Joshua Harrold, Associate Principal at BNIM. "I think Bendheim has been a great collaborator in that respect." Bendheim's previous experience with the design of parking structure façades on this scale includes 1 South Halsted/727 West Madison in Chicago, Ill., and the Mueller Parking Structure in Austin, Tex.

Answers to the most popular questions about parking at SFO

For years my father-in-law worked at the San Francisco International Airport (SFO). This made parking a dream. Every time we had to <u>fly out of SFO</u> he would just park in staff parking and we'd take the Air Train into the terminal. It wasn't until he retired that I was forced to dive into the world of <u>SFO parking</u>, parking *near* SFO and all the options for getting to and from the airport.

Turns out SFO parking is not nearly as confusing as it seemed at first, but it does require a little planning ahead. Keep reading for top parking tips to make your next trip out of SFO a bit easier.

Official parking at the airport includes a few options. These are, in order from cheapest to most expensive: long-term parking; hourly parking at both the domestic and international terminals; and Park Fast and Park Valet services, which are closest to the terminals.

There are also a few other private parking lots and transit options near, but not at, the San Francisco International Airport. Save time (and money) by booking your SFO airport parking before you go.

600 new parking spaces to open to public at Las Vegas airport Friday

LAS VEGAS, Nev. - Hundreds of new parking spaces will open up at Harry Reid International Airport tomorrow, according to an airport spokesperson.

The 600 covered parking spaces are new for the public in the Terminal 1 long-term parking structure. About 1,000 more uncovered parking spots are expected to be made available soon.

The new parking comes after what was described as <u>"unprecedented" demand</u> for parking over the holidays. The parking is converted from previous employee parking.

Airport officials believe the unusual surge in demand can be attributed to more travel from locals; Harry Reid Airport is also the closest option for outlying areas such as St. George, Laughlin, Pahrump and other cities outside the Valley, and those visitors will often drive to Las Vegas and park in long-term parking.

NREL Study Shows Airport Energy Savings in Surprising Places: How You Find Your Way Around

As you walk through the airport's glass doors, your phone buzzes. You open the camera, hold it in front of you, and spin a slow 360 degrees. When you look at your phone screen, bright, translucent arrows overlay the ground in front of you, guiding you through the revolving doors and pointing you to the airport's security checkpoint. As you move through the terminal, the digital arrows steer you down a corridor, onto a train, up an escalator, and finally to your gate, where your plane is almost ready to board.

This experience, called "augmented reality navigation," is just one of a host of emerging digital technologies that aim to make passengers' travel through airports more equitable and energy-efficient—not to mention more convenient.

And these futuristic technologies take center stage in <u>a new, comprehensive analysis</u> by National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) researchers that aims to reimagine how sustainability figures into the way people travel to (and through) enormous facilities like airports.
