

Airport Ground Transportation Vehicles

Continued advancements in communications technologies have enabled the development of telematics applications to improve real-time data to manage drivers and fleets. Telematics systems can be used to identify unsafe driving behaviors, critical areas of risk on airport property, validate (or invalidate) complaints and customer incident reports, and support a driver training program by way of employee-specific data and analysis. This session will present case studies of airport that have successfully adopted telematic technologies to improve fleet management and operations. There will also be an update on electrification of vehicles as addressing climate change becomes an increasingly urgent issue.

Airport Ground Transportation Information Concessions Agreement

In this session you will hear from operators about new airport partnerships to provide high level taxi services. We will discuss how new taxi concession agreements need to be drafted to provide airports the highest level of safety and customer service. We will also review what airports need to expect from providers in regards to technology, management, and resources.

This session will also provide an update to deployment of Waymo autonomous vehicles at Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport. Waymo vehicles have been operating in the Phoenix region since last fall and this update will describe the experiences to date.

Emerging Airport Ground Transportation Technologies

This session will discuss the leveraging legacy and emerging modes for enhancing airport access and demand based dynamic pricing and revenue management. Transportation and ground access technologies will increase the complexity of landside activity at airports. Technologies such as autonomous, automated, connected, and electric vehicles will affect all components of an airport's landside facilities, including roadways, curbs, parking, and ground transportation centers. This presentation will discuss demand-based dynamic pricing and revenue management and share examples of recent trends, and how airports have recovered quite well from the Pandemic utilizing these strategies.

Airport Ground Transportation Sustainability

Airport sustainably affects all aspects of airport operations. Tools and techniques that can improve sustainability will be discussed, including examples that demonstrate how practices can be adopted by airport operators. In addition, this session will review curbside and terminal area roadway programs that airport staff can readily implement to achieve maximum efficiency, safety, security, and customer service. These discussions will be based on the 2024 update of ACRP Report 40: Airport Curbside and Terminal Area Roadway Operations, published in 2010. The update presents scalable strategies for traffic demand and congestion management addressing: policy and regulatory issues, typical peak vs. irregular operations and traffic demands, stakeholder engagement and possible political issues, and operational techniques and new technologies being used by airports and ground transportation providers.


